

Dear passengers, we hope that you will consider (because it is in the interest of your safety as well) the need and the obligation of carrying out security checks and inspections of persons and luggage (before entering security areas of restricted access and aircraft), and please:

- report all liquids;
- isolate laptops and other electronic devices (MP3 players, cell phones, etc.);
- take off your coat and/or jacket, which will be examined as a separate piece of hand luggage, and
- comply with other appropriate requirements of authorized officers during security checks and controls.

To help us with your luggage, pack it yourself and take into consideration the items that are not allowed to be carried in your luggage. Do not leave your luggage unattended while staying at the airport as this is against the rules.

If you have any further questions, please contact your carrier, travel agency or us upon arrival at the airport, our staff will always meet you and clarify your duties and responsibilities and answer your questions¹.



PASSENGERS AND CABIN LUGGAGE PROHIBITED ITEMS

The following items are not permitted to be brought in the security area of restricted access and the aircraft (whether on its own or in hand luggage):

- a) **pistols, firearms and other firing devices** devices that can be used, really or seemingly, to inflict serious injuries by firing shots, including the following:
 - firearms of all kinds, such as pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns;
 - gun- toys, replicas and imitations of firearms that may be mistakenly thought to be real weapons;
 - components of firearms, excluding telescopic sights;
 - compressed air and CO₂ guns, such as revolvers, air rifles, rifles and pistols, which have bullets;
 - signal flares and starters;
 - bows, crossbows and arrows;
 - rifles for firing harpoons and spears; and
 - baby slings and catapults.
- b) **stunning devices** devices specifically designed to stun or prevent movement, including the following:
 - shocking devices such as stun guns, batons and stun sticks;
 - devices for stunning and killing animals; and
 - disabling chemicals, gases and sprays, such as stunning spray, pepper spray, hot pepper spray, tear gas, spray with acid and animal repellent.

¹For additional actions, in individual cases, responsible persons will comply with the provisions of the instruction entitled: Suspicious, prohibited and dangerous items and Substances (UP 09 26) established by the Sarajevo International Airport Security Committee and approved by the BiH Directorate of Civil Aviation.



- c) **items with a sharp tip or a sharp edge** items with sharp point or sharp edge that can cause serious body injury, including:
 - items designed for cutting, such as axes, little axes and short butcher's axes;
 - axes and picks for breaking ice;
 - razors;
 - box cutters;
 - knives with blades longer than 6 cm;
 - scissors with blades longer than 6 cm measured from the lever support;
 - martial arts equipment having sharp points or edges; and
 - swords and sabres.
- d) **workers' tools** tools that can cause serious injury or jeopardize the safety of aircraft, including: iron levers;
 - drills and drill taps, including portable battery powered drills;
 - tools with blade or sharp arrow longer than 6 cm that can be used as a weapon, such as screwdriver and chisel;
 - saws, including portable battery-operated saws;
 - blowlamps; and

e)

- guns with arrows and nails.
- **blunt tools** items that can be used to inflict serious body injuries if used to strike, including: baseball sticks and "small" baseball sticks;
 - police sticks, short metal, leather-coated sticks and batons; and
 - martial arts equipment.
- f) **explosives and flammable substances and devices** explosives and flammable substances and devices that may cause serious body injuries or endanger the safety of aircraft, including the following:
 - ammunition;
 - initial capsules;
 - detonators and fuses;

g) replicas or imitation of explosive devices

- mines, grenades and other military explosive devices;
- firecrackers and other pyrotechnics;
- smoke cans and cartridges; and
- dynamite, gunpowder and plastic explosives.



Liquids, aeroslos and gels

Liquids, aerosols and gels, other than those in individual cans of up to 100 milliliters (or equivalent), that have been placed in a transparent plastic bag with fastener of up to 1 liter (or equivalent).

a Content of the plastic bag should be arranged neatly and the bag completely closed (see picture).

This can be waived for medicines, milk/baby food and special diet foods.



CHECKED-IN LUGGAGE - AIRCRAFT LUGGAGE PROHIBITED ITEMS

Passengers may not carry in separate luggage the following items:

Explosives and flammable substances and devices - explosives and flammable substances and devices that may cause serious body injuries or endanger the safety of aircraft, including the following:

- ammunition;
- initial capsules;
- detonators and fuses;
- mines, grenades and other military explosive devices;
- firecrackers and other pyrotechnics;
- smoke cans and cartridges; and
- dynamite, gunpowder and plastic explosives.

Exemption: With the permission of the operator, certain cartridges may be permitted for transport in separate luggage, under the conditions set out in Part 8, Chapter 1, 1.1.2 of the Technical instructions for the safe air transport of dangerous goods (Doc.9284). Each case will be handled individually.

CARGO AND MAIL PROHIBITED ITEMS

Explosives and flammable substances and devices - Explosives and flammable substances and devices that may cause serious body injuries or endanger the safety of aircraft, including the following:

- ammunition;
- initial capsules;
- detonators and fuses;
- mines, grenades and other military explosive devices;
- firecrackers and other pyrotechnics;
- smoke cans and cartridges; and
- dynamite, gunpowder and plastic explosives.

Exemption: With the permission of the operator, certain cartridges may be permitted for transport in separate luggage, under the conditions set out in Part 8, Chapter 1, 1.1.2 of the Technical instructions for the safe air transport of dangerous goods (Doc.9284).
